AMERICAN SWEETGUM Liquidambar styraciflua



Number of trees: 1 Bark ID color: NONE

The distinctive star-shaped leaves are a medium green in summer, turning shades of yellow, orange, red, and purple in the fall. The bur-like, woody fruit capsules persist into winter and grow to be 1"-11/2" long.

RED MAPLE Acer rubrum



Number of trees: 2 Bark ID color: ORANGE

Emerging leaves are reddish-tinged, gradually changing to medium or dark green with red stems throughout spring and summer. Seeds ripen in spring, and leaves turn to crimson red in fall.

Mature Height 40'-60' Mature Canopy Spread 40' Growth Rate Medium (13"-24" per year) to Fast (25" or more per year) Sun Preference Full Sun, Partial Shade Soil Preference Acidic, Clay, Loamy, Moist, Rich, Sandy, Well-Drained or Wet

NORTHERN RED OAK Quercus rubra



Number of trees: 1 Bark ID color: RED

After 25 years, it produces 3/4"-1" acorns. Leaves are a shiny green in summer, turning russet-red to bright red in fall.

SCARLET OAK *Quercus coccinea*



Bark ID color: PURPLE Number of trees: 1

Medium (13"-24" per year)

It produces 1/2"-1" acorns after 20 years. The deep green leaves of summer turn brilliant red or scarlet in the fall.

SILVER MAPLE Acer saccharinum



Bark ID color: SILVER

The seeds ripen in late spring to early summer. In summer, the leaves are green on top with a silvery-white underside. They turn vellow in the fall. Place at least 10' from sidewalk or drive.

Dark green summer leaves turn into brilliant shades of vellow, orange, or red

SUGAR MAPLE Acer saccharum

60'-75' 40'-50' Slow (12" or less per year) to Medium (13"-24" per year) Full Sun. Partial Shade Acidic or Alkaline, Drought-tolerant, Well-drained

WASHINGTON HAWTHORN Crataegus phaenopyrum

Bark ID color: YELLOW

White spring flowers are followed by 1/4" red fruits that stay on the tree into winter. Thorny stems produce reddish-purple leaves that change to dark green in summer, then to orange, scarlet, or purple in fall. High wildlife value.

20'-30' 25' Medium (13"-24" per year) Full Sun Acidic or Alkaline, Clay, Drought-tolerant, Loamy, Moist,Sandy, Well-drained, or Wet

WHITE FLOWERING DOGWOOD Cornus florida



Bark ID color: WHITE

Showy, white spring petal-like bracts are followed by glossy red $\frac{1}{2}$ " fruits that ripen in fall and linger into winter. Summer's dark green leaves turn red-purple in fall. This tree has a high wildlife value.
