Please refer to the information below to identify each tree species in your bundle and to ensure proper planting sites and conditions for each.

IDENTIFICATION CHART

10 Oak Trees (Tree Package 3182)

Species	Bark ID Color
2 Bur Oaks (Quercus macrocarpa)	None
2 Pin Oaks (Quercus palustris)	Pink
2 Red Oaks (Quercus rubra)	Red
2 Scarlet Oaks (Quercus coccinea)	Purple
2 Willow Oaks (Quercus phellos)	Yellow

BUR OAK Quercus macrocarpa



Number of trees: 2 Bark ID color: NONE

After 35 years, it produces fringed acorns %"-1½" long and %"-2" in diameter. Leaves are dark green in summer, turning dull tan in winter. This oak provides food and shelter for a wide variety of birds and animal life.

Mature Height 70'-80'

Growth Rate Slow (12" or less per year)

Sun Preference Full Sui

Soil Preference Acidic or Alkaline, Clay, Drought-tolerant, Loamy,

Sandy, Well-drained, or Wet

PIN OAK Quercus palustris



Number of trees: 2 Bark ID color: PINK

Leaves are a glossy dark green in summer, turning scarlet to bronze in fall. After 20 years, it produces ½" acorns.

Mature Height 60'-70'
Mature Canopy Spread 25'-40'

Growth Rate Fast (25" or more per year)

Sun Preference Full Sun

Soil Preference Acidic, Clay, Loamy, Moist, Rich, Sandy,

Well-drained, or Wet

NORTHERN RED OAK Quercus rubra



Number of trees: 2 Bark ID color: RED

After 25 years, it produces ¾"-1" acorns. Leaves are a shiny green in summer, turning russet-red to bright red in fall.

Mature Height 60'-75'
Mature Canopy Spread 45'

Growth Rate Fast (25" or more per year)

Sun Preference Full Sun

Soil Preference Acidic, Clay, Drought-tolerant, Loamy,

Moist, Sandy, Well-drained

SCARLET OAK Quercus coccinea



Number of trees: 2 Bark ID color: PURPLE

It produces ½"-1" acorns after 20 years. The deep green leaves of summer turn brilliant red or scarlet in the fall.

Mature Height 60'-80'
Mature Canopy Spread 40'-50'

Growth Rate Medium (13"–24" per year)

WILLOW OAK Quercus phellos



Number of trees: 2 Bark ID color: YELLOW

A handsome oak with willow-like leaves. Foliage is light to bright green in summer and yellow, yellow-brown, and russet in fall.

Mature Height 40'-60' Mature Canopy Spread 30'-40'

Growth Rate Medium (13"–24" per year)

Sun Preference Full Sun
