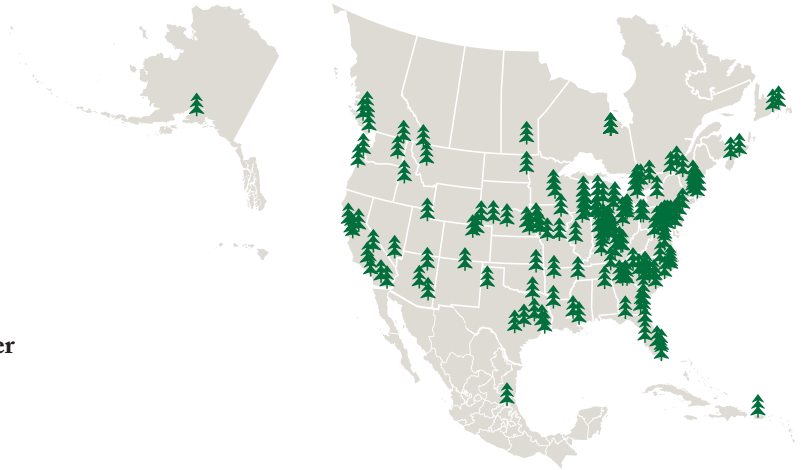


# ALLIANCE FOR COMMUNITY TREES

## A year of helping nonprofits extend their reach

In 2022, 204 community projects were supported with funding through the Alliance for Community Trees to help make a meaningful difference. That means:

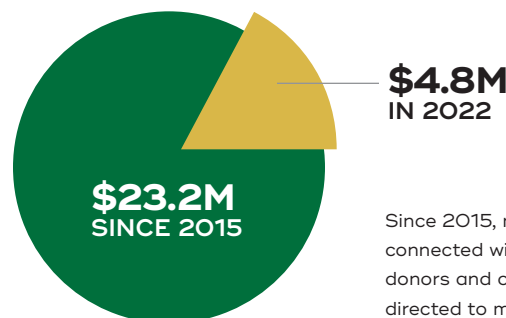

## Growing opportunities for members

Members of the Alliance for Community Trees network are strengthened by the support of private sector investments in urban tree planting and distribution.



Since 2015, member organizations have been connected with \$23.2 million in funding from donors and corporate partners, with \$4.8 million directed to member projects in 2022 alone.

## Investing in people

### NETWORKING AND TRAINING

Members can access ongoing training opportunities and have the ability to tap into the collective experience of a knowledgeable network of urban forestry leaders.

### MENTOR EXCHANGE PROGRAM

Co-sponsored by the USDA Forest Service, this yearly program matches the learning objectives of five organizations with other network members who have excelled in those areas. Travel and lodging are provided for participants to meet in-person with their counterparts for an in-depth knowledge exchange.

### ALLIANCE FOR COMMUNITY TREES DAY

This one-day conference is packed with peer-to-peer learning opportunities, networking, and educational sessions all focused on strengthening the future of urban and community forestry.

### ONLINE MEMBERSHIP PORTAL

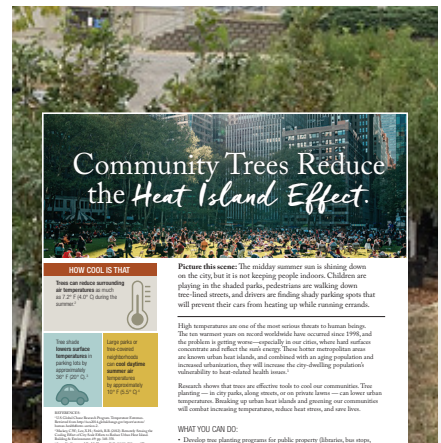
