

PROGRAM SPOTLIGHTS

At **Mayo Clinic in Rochester, Minnesota**, the campus tree care plan establishes a goal of not only nurturing campus trees, but fostering an ethic of environmental stewardship within the campus. In 2022, a segment on the Mayo Clinic News Network highlighted the health benefits of being connected to nature, including forests, and how physicians are prescribing time in nature to patients. Additionally, an article about the health benefits of urban trees was shared in the hospital's Green Advocate Newsletter for employees.

For Arbor Day 2022, **Edgerton Hospital and Health Services in Edgerton, Wisconsin**, planted 75 oak trees in the woods adjacent to campus, which are home to hiking trails accessible by the community. The trees were donated by the Rock County Land Conservation Department and volunteers representing the community, the local trail alliance, and the Boy Scouts helped plant the trees. Each volunteer took home their own tree.
